Advanced MARC Editing functions




For most of our customers cataloging with our extensive templates allows you to create a detailed and comprehensive MARC record with the Leader and Control field information set automatically.

But for those of you who want the added advantage of seeing and potentially adding information to those fields, we offer the Advanced MARC Editing function.




Activating Advanced MARC Editing is easy.



On the Search Screen, click the Preferences Button (1). In the dialog box (2), check Use Advanced MARC editor (3) and then select OK.



Once you've activated the Advanced MARC editor, you'll notice a few differences in the Cataloger.



The Leader and Control fields will be visible.


Different Control fields apply for different material types and may not all be present but can be added from the Add Field menu.

Field 005 is grayed out, indicating that it isn't editable.

This field indicates the last date and time this record was edited. This is done automatically when the record is saved.



As with other fields in the Cataloger, built-in tools become available when applicable.



For example, when the cursor is in the 008 field, the Library of Congress button activates, allowing you to Library of Congress' website to verify rules and/or codes without leaving the cataloger.

The external site opens in a new window and can be kept open and minimized or moved to another part of the screen as you catalog..

This information can also help you identify the meaning of the codes in each field.



A note of caution.

Incorrect lengths or values for the Leader or Control fields can seriously damage the MARC record, making it unusable.

If you are uncertain how to enter or change codes in these fields, we strongly recommend leaving them as is.

Mitinet Library Services has created over 40 templates for creating MARC records, each of them designed for a very specific material type, with the appropriate Leader and Control Field information automatically added.

The majority of your cataloging can be performed using these templates as they've been written.
